Best practices for processing NSE students through admissions, fee payment, financial aid, and registration

TUITION RECIPROCITY - Selecting a Tuition Payment Plan

The National Student Exchange uses two plans for the payment of tuition and fees. The institution may use either or both plans. Using both plans offers more flexibility to the student in selecting an NSE location which best fits financial considerations as well as the probabilities for placements. Current institutional, board, or state policies, including existing international exchange or other reciprocity models, may set a precedent for and/or govern the utilization of one or both of these tuition payment plans.

Key Contacts and Written Procedures – NSE recommends that the campus identify an NSE contact in each key processing office: admissions, bursar/comptroller, financial aid, records/registration. Working with the NSE campus coordinator and using this document as a guideline, these officers should develop written procedures for NSE and review periodically to fine-tune where needed.

Such a course keeps the student tied to the home institution and establishes appropriate audit trails through bursar/comptroller, financial aid and registration. The Plan A holding course (i.e., NSE 450A for 12 hours/semester or 15 hours/quarter) should have a code which generates no bill or a bill of zero. Financial Aid Application	Plan A students apply for federally-funded financial aid at their host campus. Students list on their FAFSA form all NSE campuses where there is the potential of being accepted on Plan A. They also list their home campus in case their plans change. Plan B students apply for financial aid in the usual manner at the home campus – and only at the home campus – and only at the home campus. Award Real Budget	The award is based on a real budget (host campus tuition/fees; travel to the host campus; and room, meals, and incidentals of the host campus). Disbursement	Disbursement is made in the same manner as students native to the campus. Disbursement can be made on the basis of the holding course. An **NSE application fee** is due for each student for whom a placement is attempted. Students should not be entered on NSE's on-line placement form until the fee has been collected by the home campus. This is an application fee and is due regardless of placement outcome, placement declined, withdrawal after placement acceptance, or subsequent ineligibility to participate. (NOTE: Most campuses assess \$50 more than the NSE fee.)

Registration/ Records Transcripting	Following exchange, host institution courses, credit hours and grades replace the holding course (see page 2) and should be recorded on the home transcript with the designation that they were taken at a particular host campus through the National Student Exchange program. Exchange Work	The NSE designator is important because it shows that the student participated in a campusbased program (as opposed to transferring out and back). Like study abroad, showing the work as part of a program demonstrates to employers and graduate schools that the student has gone beyond the expected. See example below.
